Baroness Finlay is chair of the National Mental Capacity Forum (England and Wales) for Ministry of Justice since 2015. She became a life-Peer in 2001 in the House of Lords; a Deputy Speaker since 2018. Previously member of various House of Lords Select Committee inquiries in Science and Technology, Allergy, the Built Environment and the Assisted Dying for the Terminally III Bill. Vice Chair of various All Party Parliamentary Groups (APPG) Founder of think-tank Living and Dying Well 2010. Chair of Alcohol Harms Commission 2019-present report 'Its Everywhere' 2020
