Having read Philosophy and Theology as an undergraduate he went on to train as a nurse and worked in the Liverpool Marie Curie Centre, during which time he completed postgraduate studies in Health Care Ethics. He also has clinical experience in non-malignant neuropathic pain research and in the role of addressing common cardiac misconceptions in the management of patients with chronic refractory angina. He has been a Trustee of the UK Clinical Ethics Network for ten years, in which capacity he and his CEAG colleagues will be hosting the UKCEN Annual Conference and workshop in Liverpool on 6-7th June 2024.
